Service

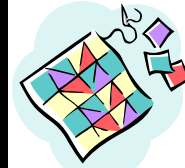
The Service Leadership team is responsible for ordering and serving luncheons for funerals.

Our Neighbors Kids is our Christmas Project. A Christmas tree with a picture of a child from Mexico and the gift they want for Christmas is placed in the social room. Anyone can pick a child and bring the gift with enough postage for mailing the gift to Mexico. We include a tract with a short note wishing them a Merry Christmas in their language.



The Service committee provides flowers for the pulpit and other areas in the church each week.

On special occasions, such as Easter and Christmas, memorials of lilies and poinsettias are purchased by the committee for members of the congregation in memory of their loved ones.



Sewing Days

Our sewing days begin in January and run for 5 weeks. All ages are welcome to come and help put quilts together, whether it be cutting, putting tops together or sewing. Lunch is provided by several ladies. Around 100 quilts are made each year. Some ladies sew throughout the year, making different size quilts, lap robes, diapers and stocking hats.

The items are shared with Beacon of Life, Broadlawn's Hospital, African Immigrants, Center of Hope, Quilts of Hope, Red Cross, House of Compassion, Parents as Teachers, Newton Pregnancy Center, Newton Salvation Army, Clearview Recovery, Hope Ministries and nursing homes.
